






May 2025 CJOS Speaker Richard Ho: Introduction to Asian Cymbidium







Asian Cymbidium Species Section Jenosa [Schlechter 1924] Acuminatum Monroanum Cyperifolium Nanulum Defoliatum • Omeiense (new) • Qiubeiense (new) Ensifolium* Serratum • Faberi* Sinense* • Goeringii* Teretipetiolatum Haematodes · Tortisepalum* Kanran* Sinense is found in Japan, China, Vietnam, Cambodia, Laos to Sumatra and Java. Goeringii is found in northwestern India, Bhutan, China, Taiwan, Ryukyu Islands, Japan and Korea. * Available in the US market. Majority come from Taiwan.

Why Grow Asian Cymbidiums? Variegated leaves Leaf stance and shape Flower Shape Flower color Fragrance Miniature to compact size Blooms in summer or early spring Oddities

Common Species in the Market Cym. ensifolium Summer thru Fall bloomer Can flower twice/year, last 2-4 weeks Temperature fluctuations are NOT critical Cym. sinense Spring Bloomer around Lunar New Year (Feb to March) Stop fertilizer mid September Cool nights, esp. in Winter 40-50°F Reduce watering in winter Day/Night differential of 10 to 20° F After flowers open, return to normal watering schedule
